In Development – THEATRE

SAM THE SWORD

An epic one-person poetic performance about a transgender tropical fish, for ages 8+. The performance will be a journey of discovery, touching on themes of self-acceptance and queer joy, developed with a full gender-non-conforming/trans team.

Currently in development – it has been commissioned as part of Edinburgh International Children's Theatre Festival – presented as a work in progress in May 2024. Supported by Pitlochry Festival Theatre, Visible Fictions and Lyth Arts Centre.

LUMBERJILLS

An intersectional feminist new musical in collaboration with Sonum Batra – celebrating the lives of the brave women trained as lumberjacks as part of WW2's Land Army. Set in a highland lodge the musical will explore the impact of the war, the gruelling training, the community spirit of the lodges and interpersonal relationships. We want to touch upon prejudicial treatment of minorities at the time, reflecting our current society... creating a storyline for a lesbian couple within the ranks, and the controversial placement of a woman of colour, mimicking the real-life Land Army career of Devon's Amelia King who despite her initial racist-motivated rejection was instated following a public outcry - uniting the nation. The piece will be inspired by real-life testimonies and the history from Drew's grandmother as a WW2 Poster-girl.

Currently in development with Capital Theatres Edinburgh – January 2024.

CAMP DAVID

A blackly comedic, candid, alcohol fuelled, blood spattered uncomfortable story about 3 generations of a dysfunctional family. It is about remembering how to connect as a unit, juggling resentment and duty, entrenched difficulties of British middle-class affluence and the legacy we leave our kids.
